

Troup House School

Troup House School is a school care accommodation service with a strong reputation for providing a high standard of education and care to 12 young people between the ages of 8 to 16. Our young people have additional support needs including social, emotional and mental health difficulties, autistic spectrum conditions and challenging behaviour. The young people may also have difficulties with learning, often as a result of trauma, a disrupted educational experience and multiple residential placements.

Troup House School is located in Banff, Aberdeenshire and aims to deliver the highest level of education and care reflecting individual needs in a safe, positive and nurturing environment in which every student is included in our school community and supported to achieve the best possible academic, social and vocational outcomes. Our provision offers a range of services from day education to 52 week care and education placements.

Holistic approach

We employ an inclusive approach to addressing and supporting our children's needs, creating opportunities to thrive and develop. We support our young people through plans and interventions based on the GIRFEC wellbeing indicators. Our care, education and support services teams engage in collaborative practice designed to ensure the best outcomes and experiences for all within our school community.

Safe and supportive community living

The service is registered as school care accommodation with HMIE, the Care Inspectorate and regulated in accordance with the National Care Standards for School Care Accommodation Services.

Every opportunity for learning is capitalised upon across 24 hours in order to emphasise the development of the four capacities of the Curriculum for Excellence. These are successful learners, confident individuals, responsible citizens and effective contributors.

Young people have access to a range of educational and social experiences to support the development of the four capacities and are presented with increased opportunities for achievement and attainment.

All young people have individualised Care and Education Plans supported by a key team including care and education practitioners in a nurturing therapeutic, physical environment. Young people are actively involved in challenge and achievement programmes within the school and the local community including access to a range of activities and work experience opportunities.

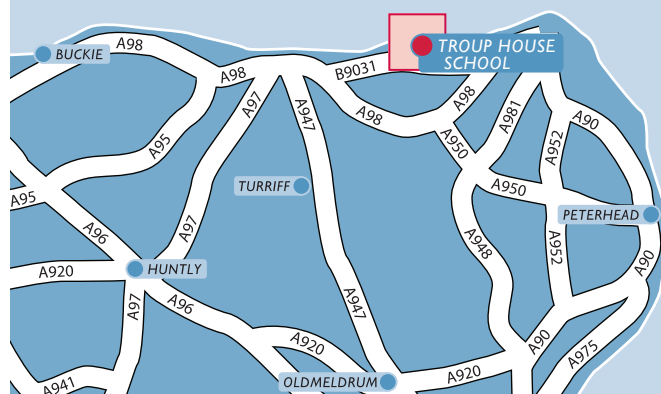
