Located on the Derbyshire and Staffordshire border, Chessington House is a spacious and nurturing children's home.

We support young people aged 8 to 18 with emotional and/or behavioural difficulties (EBD), and learning difficulties.

Supporting the needs of the young people

Chessington House has a dedicated and welcoming staff team, who all take the same approach of ensuring that the young people are at the forefront of any decisions made around their care. We ensure that everyone has a voice and are able to express their views and input into how they want to be cared for whilst at the home.

The staff team also have a strong ethos in ensuring that the young people obtain the required skills in preparation for their transition into adult life. We ensure that they can build on their self-esteem, promote their independence, and achieve positive outcomes that any other young person not in care would achieve.



Service summary

The range of services and facilities available at Chessington House includes:

- A safe, homely and nurturing environment, situated within a quiet and rural location
- Accommodation comprising of 5 individual bedrooms,
 which the young people are encouraged to personalise
- A range of spacious facilities, including 2 lounges, a dining room, a family-style kitchen and an arts and crafts room
