The college works in partnership with mainstream colleges and is adjacent to Coleg Cambria in Wrexham, an outstanding tertiary college renowned for delivering excellence in further and higher education.

Aspris College North Wales provides a safe and supportive learning environment where young adults can explore their own experience of autism and associated conditions and develop strategies for managing their condition in their daily lives whilst attending a mainstream college locally. We specialise in empowering students to self-manage their anxieties in order to unlock their full potential.

With a dedicated team of staff, we provide every young person with a personalised programme of education, care, work experience, leisure and life skills and training within the community, to enable them to live as independently as possible and make their own life choices.

Our admissions criteria

- Aged between 16 and 25 years
- A diagnosis of ASD or evidence of behaviours which are in accordance with such a diagnosis
- Referrals from Careers Wales, Local Authorities and/or social care and self-referral
- Must not have significant medical care needs that would require a medical practitioner to be on site

- Access to a sensory garden and community based projects
- Counselling
- Speech and language therapy
- Social and emotional aspects of learning interventions
